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Re: Nationwide Permit Section 401 Water Quality Certification

Dear Mr. Steinle,

The Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes Natural Resource Department is responding to the Corps of Engineers' request for Section 401 Water Quality Certification on Nationwide Permits (NWP's), general conditions and definitions with some modifications published on February 21, 2012, in addition to two new NWP's, three new general conditions and three new definitions. Pursuant to 40 CFR Part 121 and Section 401 of the Clean Water Act the Department has reviewed the proposed Nationwide Permits for 2012 and have denied or waived 401 Certification based upon potential impacts to Water Quality on the Flathead Indian Reservation. The Department's Section 401 Certification decisions are listed below.

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
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For all NWP's issued within the exterior boundaries of the Flathead Indian Reservation the Department requests a copy of the 404 application and a 401 Water Quality Certification. On Nationwide permits that have been denied the Department will review the proposed permit activity and issue a project-specific 401 Certification decision on each permit. On NWP's that have been waived the Department would like notification of such activities.

The Department withholds Section 401 Water Quality Certification on Nationwide permit 26 Reserved. If the Corps proposes a new Nationwide Permit 26, the Department will make a 401 Certification decision at that time upon notification and request from the Corps.
