

U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS AND COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO HOLD A PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE MEETING ON THE U.S. 287 REALIGNMENT ALTERNATIVES TO BE EVALUATED AS PART OF THE NORTHERN INTEGRATED SUPPLY PROJECT

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Colorado Department of Transportation will hold a public open house as part of their efforts to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposed Northern Integrated Supply Project (NISP). The project, as proposed by the Northern Colorado Water Conservancy District acting through the Northern Integrated Supply Project Water Activity Enterprise (District), includes construction of Glade and Galeton Reservoirs. Construction of Glade Reservoir will require the relocation of U.S. Highway 287, beginning at about Ted's Place and extending approximately 7 miles north.

A public open house meeting will be held to provide the public with an opportunity to review the U.S. 287 realignment alternatives that are proposed for consideration during the NISP EIS. The open house will provide an opportunity for the public to provide input into the process, including the identification of concerns and issues associated with the proposed U.S. 287 realignment alternatives.
