### **Types of Authorization/Permits**



Some flood-related work activities do not require a Department of the Army (DA) permit.

No "blanket permits" for flood-related repair activities in waters of the U.S.

#### **Nationwide Permits (NWPs)**

Nationwide permits authorize the discharge of fill material in waters of the U.S. (including wetlands) that will result in minimal impacts to the environment.

Common NWPs used during/post flood events:

NWP #3 - Maintenance

**NWP #12 – Utility Line Activities** 

NWP #13 - Bank Stabilization

NWP #45 – Repair of Uplands damaged by Discrete Events









#### **Regional General Permits (RGPs)**

These permits authorize certain flood-related fill or excavation activities; other work associated with flood protection; and repair work for flood-damaged areas performed in waters of the U.S.

#### **OMAHA SPECIFIC RGPs**

Nebraska RGP 11-02
North Dakota RGP 9601-07
South Dakota RGP 96-08
Colorado RGP 96-07

Montana \*Under Development\* (2016)

#### **Standard Permits (SP)**

Also referred to as Individual Permit process, it authorizes activities in waters of the U.S. beyond NWP/RGP impact thresholds. Utilized more frequently during post flood recovery activities.







### **Types of Authorization/Permits**

#### **EMERGENCY AUTHORIZATION PROCEDURES**

More extensive flood repair work which exceeds NWP/RGP limits may be authorized under emergency authorization procedures when there is an unacceptable hazard to life, significant loss of property and/or an immediate, unforeseen, and significant economic hardship if corrective action requiring a permit is not undertaken within a time period less than the normal time needed to process an application under standard procedures.

\*Coordination with Northwestern Division (NWD) required\*

Some flood-related work activities do not require a (DA) permit.

No "blanket permits" for flood-related work in waters of the U.S.

Many permits require notification prior to work.
